

What Is ATNE and How Does it Work?

Recently we have received numerous questions about Average Total Number of Employees or ATNE and how it relates to employer groups.

ATNE is the method by which the state of PA will define group size under the Affordable Care Act. Any individual for whom the company issues a W-2 (including full-time, part-time and seasonal employees) is counted in the calculation of ATNE. The average number of employees throughout a 12 month period will determine market segment.

Example ATNE Calculations

The group in the example below is considered a small group because their average total number of employees is 21.

Although at first glance, the group in the next example (below) may appear to be a small group, when the ATNE calculation is completed their average total number of employees is 52 and therefore they are **not** considered a small group.
